## **ABCs of Behavior**

### **ANTECEDENT**

Events that occur immediately BEFORE the behavior

Can be altered to 1 or the occurrence of a behavior

### **BEHAVIOR**

Observable and measureable response to things and events around us at any given time

### CONSEQUENCE

Events that occur immediately AFTER the behavior

Can 1 or 1 the likelihood that the person will display the behavior again

# **Examples**

- Task demands
- Transitions
- Peer takes a preferred toy
- Teacher is talking to another student

Classroom expectations/ appropriate behaviors

- Raising hand before talking
- Keeping hands to self while playing

Inappropriate behaviors

- Talking while the teacher is talking
- Taking peer's toy

- Teacher providing reprimands or reassurance
- Removal of toy or other item
- Providing a toy
- Being sent to the principal's office

# **Classroom Management Strategies Based on ABC Model**

# **Antecedent strategies**

- Setting Clear Expectations
- Environmental Arrangement
- Teaching Routines & Schedules
- Visual supports
- Supervision
- Promoting Active Engagement,
- Prompting
- Pre-corrections (social stories, behavioral contracts, first-then boards)

### **Response Strategies**

- Planned Ignoring (of minor, nonharmful inappropriate behaviors)
- Performance Feedback/Error Correction
- Behavior specific praise
- Differential reinforcement of appropriate behavior
