- III. Blueprint for Collective Action Discussion
  - a. Katie Booz shared a google document with ICA members only to review the Blueprint for Collective Action.
  - b. ICA members were asked to review Improvement Area 1 and to add comments on the document for what has been achieved, partially achieved, or not achieved.
  - c. Discussion:
    - i. Brian Freedman noted that it is hard to achieve broader things (achieved vs partially achieved). He elaborated that something is more achieved if it is available to everyone.
    - ii. Crystal Thawley shared that as a parent it's difficult to complete this task since she is not involved on this side of things usually.
    - iii. Brian Hall shared that it would be interesting to hear how the Blueprint impacts families and if the improvement areas are achieving what they were created for.
      - 1. Sarah Mallory responded that as the DNEA organizes all of the information, they can add a section to add scope of impact.
  - d. Next steps
    - i. After this meeting, ICA members are asked to continue reviewing and adding comments.
    - ii. Feedback is just the first step. We will be addressing the comments in future ICA meetings, as well as continuing to work on going through the Blueprint.
- IV. Public Comment
  - a. Dafne Carnright commented in the chat: I agree with Brian. All parents and professionals understanding is also hard to achieve because new individuals are coming into the autism community all the time, new families, new staff, etc.
- V. DNEA Funding Update
  - a. The DNEA is funded annually through the Governor's budget by the Health Fund Advisory Committee (HFAC). The DNEA has been receiving funding since its inception.
    - i. This year, HFAC were particularly rigorous in their approval process, leading to some projects not being funded.
    - ii. The DNEA will be 80% funded for FY26.
      - The DNEA is regrouping and discussing how to make up that 20%. The Center for Disabilities Studies is good at getting external funding and the DNEA is confident that they will make up the 20%.
    - iii. JFC hearings are up next. The DNEA will keep the ICA posted on how they go.
  - b. Brian Freedman shared in the chat "congrats these funds have always been

earmarked to start and it's always been a struggle to get funding so the fact the DNEA got the funding is great and shows the state's confidence in the work being done by the DNEA."

- c. Brian Hall asked if the DNEA has received any support letters from law enforcement.
  - i. Sarah Mallory responded that yes, the DNEA had multiple letters of support including law enforcement and Brian Freedman.
- d. Autism Delaware Update
  - i. Autism Delaware does not have an associative executive director; it is just Brian Hall right now.
  - ii. Parent/Grandparent coffee hours are continuing.
  - iii. Holiday parties in each county are coming up.

  - a. Brian Freedman: Nemours Swank Autism Center
    - i. They are very excited to add 2 developmental pediatricians to the group at Nemours. One is starting in February, and the other one is starting in September.
    - ii. Plan to hire another psychologist who will start next fall.
    - iii. The outpatient psychiatry department is open to the community, even if you are not a Nemours patient.
  - b. Isabel Rivera-Green: Division of Public Health
    - i. Vendor Parent Information Center through Family SHADE is looking to recruit family leadership network members.
